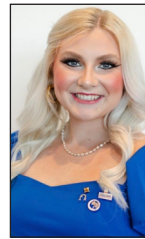
advantage of the resources available to you. Remember, college is not just about academics; it's also about personal growth, building lasting friendships, and creating memories that will last a lifetime.

Association of Indian Students

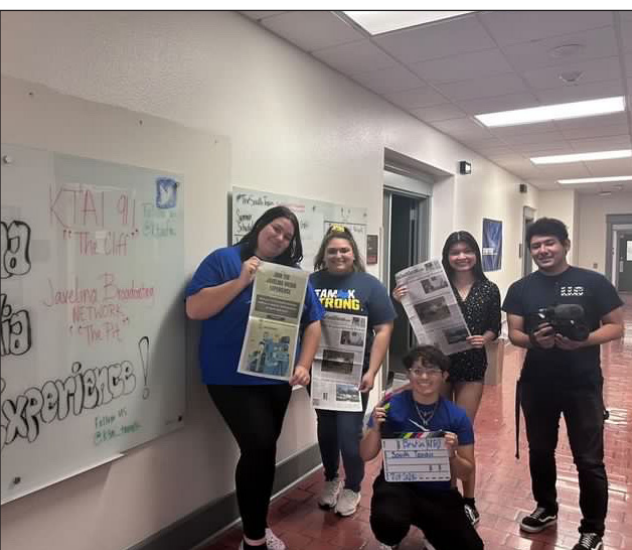
AIS is a student body organization that brings together Indian students to create a sense of community and provide support to Indian students during their academic journey abroad.

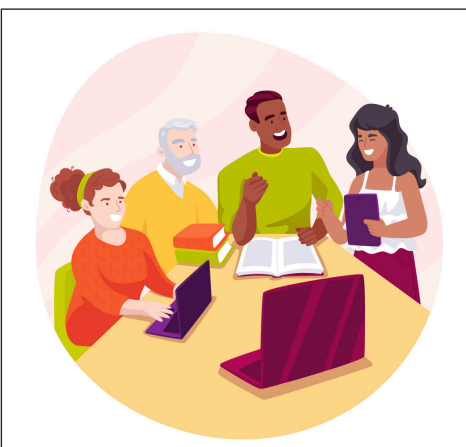

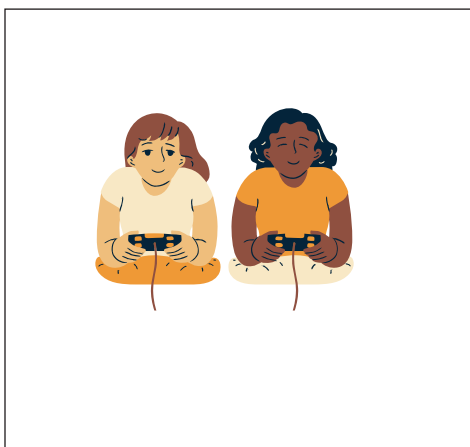
Peer Assisted Learning

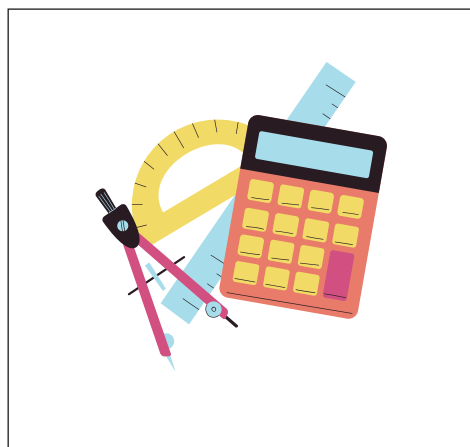

Writing Center

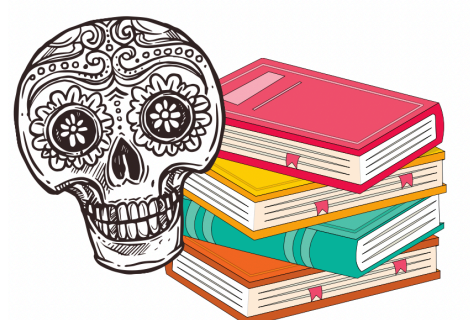
Students can visit the writing center in Room 217 of the Jernigan Library to strengthen their writing skills. Hours are as follows,

MONEY CONNECT

Payment options available:

Option 1: Online in MoneyConnect through JNET using credit/debit cards, electronic checks, and International wire transfer. Authorized users (granted access by students) and Community members needing to pay Nursery charges may use the direct MoneyConnect login. Former/unadmitted students/Nursery: User Name is your K00# and PIN is your DOB (mmddyy). If unsuccessful on this method only, you may call the Business Office at 361-593-2616 to ask for a password reset. Current/admitted students must go through JNET.

Option 2: In-person using money orders, cashier's checks and third party scholarship checks only; no cash or cards. Make checks payable to TAMUK and include a Banner ID number (K00XXXXXX).

Option 3: Payment Plans

Returned Payments

Any payment that is rejected for payment by the paying bank, credit card company, or other financial institution is subject to returned item charges of \$30 or more. Rejected payments may also result in cancellation of the student's registration or immediate removal of payment plan enrollment if the student does not pay within one week of the returned payment. If registration is canceled, students may also be required to re-register on or after the first class day and additional late registration penalties may be assessed.

FLYWIRE

Flywire is a program designed to help students make a payment anytime and anywhere. Students who are new to Flywire can create an account following these steps:

Step 1: Log into JNET.

Step 2: In the My Account channel, click the icon next to your student account balance. If you do not have an account balance, you will not be able to use FlyWire.

Step 3: Initiate a payment, enter an amount to pay, and choose International Payment.

Step 4: The amount is transferred into the Flywire system. Note that you may not pay less than \$50 or more than your current account balance. Select the country you want to pay from.

Step 5: Select the payment option that is best suited for you.

Step 6: New users will need to create a new account. Fill out the form using current information. Once the form is completed click continue with payment.

Step 7: You will need to fill out the forms that are displayed. When you have completed filling out the forms click continue with payment.

Step 8: This page allows you to have an overview of all the information. If you need to make any changes you may do so by clicking edit payment information. If everything is correct click continue with payment.

Step 9: Input the card details along with the cardholder details. You may select make payment or cancel payment.

OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR

The office is responsible for maintaining academic integrity of student records, processing student registrations, transcripts requests, enrollment verifications, changes of major/minor/concentrations, changing biographical data and grade changes. Student Health & Wellness

The Student Health and Wellness provides students with a chance to reserve a time to sit and relax with their aroma therapy, massage chair and virtual reality escape. They also direct students to the disability resource center and assign them to a counselor or trained professional. The health and wellness center provides students with an opportunity to gain coping skills to best handle their mental crisis and certain circumstances in an individualized plan. To schedule a relaxing moment or visit the Student Disability Resource Center students can reach out to the Student Health and Wellness Center, located behind the Business Building parking lot, or call (361) 593-3024.

FINANCIAL AID

Located in Room 132 of the Student Memorial Union Building the financial aid office is here to answer any questions regarding, but not limited to, grants, loans, scholarships, waivers and work-study. Students can stop by their office Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. or call (361) 593-5372.

Parking Permits Information & Prices

To purchase a parking permit students must provide their K00#, KU#, vehicle information and driver's license. All permits must be requested online and can only be picked up at the Business Office located in College Hall in Room 104 or mailed once it has been paid for. On Aug. 19, "blue" residential parking permits will be available for purchase. Prices for student parking permits are \$150 for Fall 2023 to Summer 2024, \$75 for Fall 2023, \$100 for both Spring and Summer 2024, and \$50 for Summer 2024.

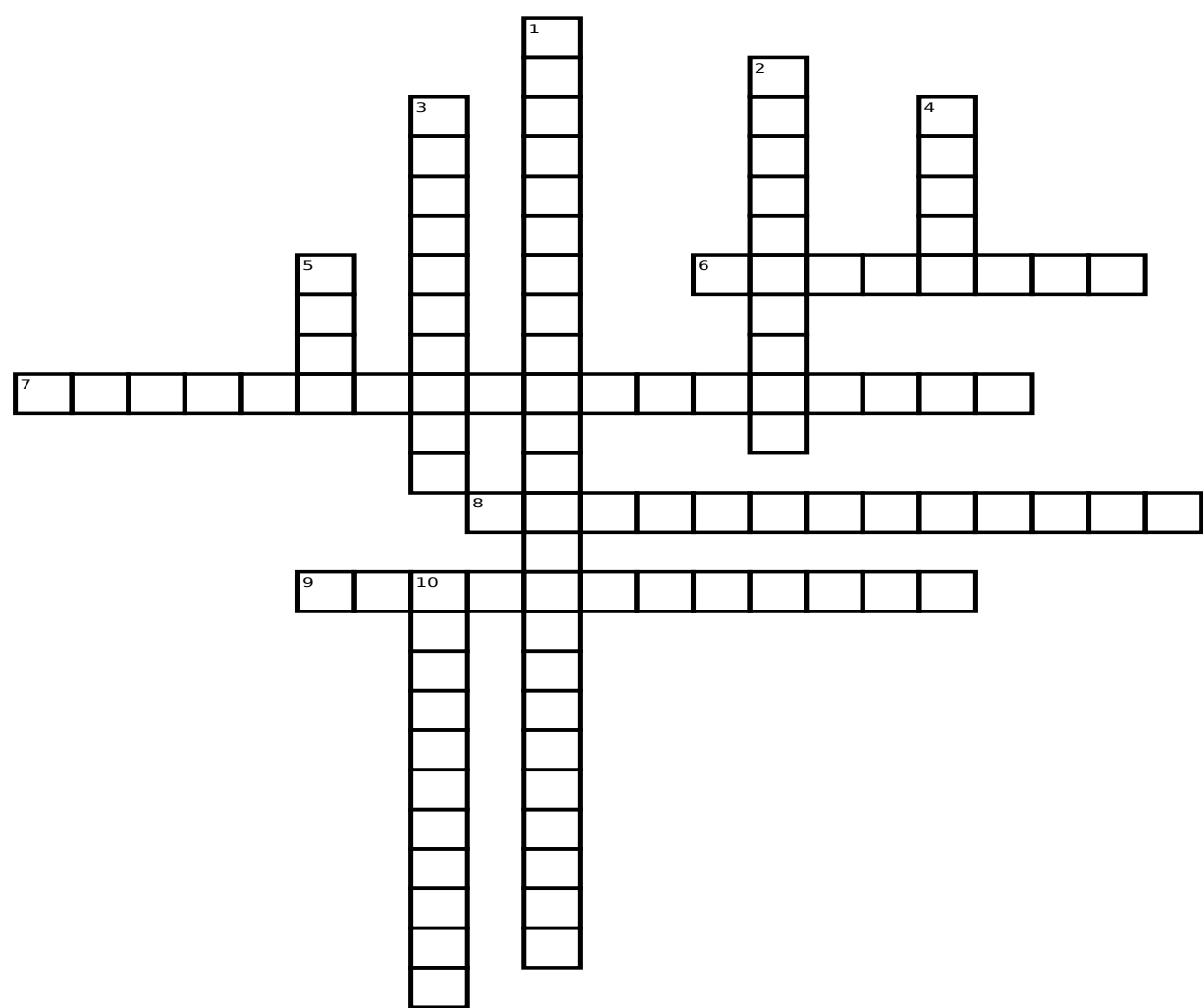
